The clocks that use to keep the city running efficiently have now stopped. their cheerful chimes now serve as a cold and eerie reminder of a threat that looms heavily throughout the city. Their times, out of sync to represent the uncertainty of an enemy unseen.

## **Description:**

I used a combination of oil pastels and graphite pencils to create two distinct effects in my piece. The sky is made with oil pastel to show a more soft and abstract background while the urban foreground has a more harsh and drastic feel to reflect the geometric atmosphere of an industrial age, European city.
