This drawing is part of my AP Art sustained investigation into the seven deadly sins, and relating the act of sin to the punishment of the sin. Many of my pieces, including this one, are inspired by ancient Christian theology and artwork. This drawing titled the "Fall of Lucifer", shows Lucifer's fall from heaven because of his arrogance and pride, and it represents prides punishment in my sustained investigation into the seven deadly sins. I did this piece using small micron pens and did thousands of lines in hatching and crosshatching patterns, and the reasoning is to emulate Northern Renaissance artists like Dürer's style of etching. With etching and printmaking being a common style during the renaissance era in Europe as well as many of the artworks being heavily inspired by Christian theology, I thought it would be fitting to have this piece be in an engraving style.
