The Keller School District Board of Directors is seeking applicants for the position of part time Superintendent-Principal.

about the position...

- The Board is looking for a successor for Mr. Wayne Massie, who has accepted a position in another school district.
- Candidates for the position must hold principal certification in the State of Washington, have prior personnel and facility management experience, and it is preferable to be eligible for Washington State superintendent certification.
- The total number of contract days will be determined by the Board in consultation with the successful candidate, and the Board will allow flexibility in the superintendent-principal's work year calendar.
- Salary will be negotiated based on the total number of work days, and will be commensurate with districts of similar size in eastern Washington.

the successful candidate...

The Board of Directors and the Keller staff desire a superintendent-principal who possesses a proven track record of strong leadership and team-building skills. In addition to serving as principal and as an effective instructional leader, additional position responsibilities may include, but not be limited to, oversight for the district's transportation services; facility management; work with Federal, State, and Tribal agencies; and leadership in instructional technology. The Keller School District contracts with NorthEast Washington ESD 101 for business management services.

OUR COMMUNITY... Keller is located in the San Poil Valley, and was founded in 1898 by John C. Keller, a local businessman. The town was located in the area now known as the San Poil Bay. The town was moved several times beginning in 1941 due to back watering from the Grand Coulee Dam which flooded its previous locations and is now located eighteen miles north of the Columbia River which seriously reduced its population over time. The population at the 2010 census was 234.

The town is encompassed by the Colville Indian Reservation, and has an estimated population of roughly 1,200 people mostly of Native American descent, primarily members of the Sanpoil Tribe of Indians, one of the Twelve Tribes that make up the Colville Confederated Tribes and one of the few Indian Nations that was never relocated by order of the U.S. Government.
