The OSD provides public education from preschool to 12th grade for students who live in the 631 square mile area of Lincoln, Grant and Adams Counties. The school district offers small class sizes, an exceptional teaching staff and excellent support from our community. Odessa is proud of the full range of offerings made available to our approximate 220 students.

A wide variety of subject matter offerings are available in the high school including Career and Technical Education with successful student organizations including FBLA and FFA. - Strong fiscal, budgeting and grant management skills and knowledge of small school finance.
- Proven leadership abilities and the ability to develop teamwork and improve staff morale.
- Willingness to engage in amicable negotiation of certificated and classified staff contracts.
- 4. Dedicated support of the current educational programs and curriculum. Ability to supervise administrative, instructional and classified staff.
- 5. Support and assistance in achieving the goals identified in the district's School Improvement Plan.
